On Friday, April 5, early childhood professionals in the District of Columbia are invited to attend the 2024 DC Early Educator Experience (DC Early EdX). This free professional development experience has been designed as an opportunity for early childhood professionals to learn, network, advocate, and celebrate in recognition of the Month of the Young Child. More than 1,300 professionals participated last year, and we are working behind the scenes to make this annual event a success. DC Early EdX is a day for educators, designed by educators.

The 2024 DC Early Educator Experience will be an in-person experience. Participants will have the opportunity to attend and earn professional development hours.

We recognize that schedule changes can be challenging and appreciate your flexibility as early childhood professionals participate in this professional development experience. During the event, participants will have the opportunity to reflect on their roles as advocates for young children while also learning skills and strategies to improve their practice. Here are additional details about DC Early EdX:

In-person event: Friday, April 5, 2024, from 9:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.

Professional development hours: Participants will earn seven professional development hours from an OSSE-approved training organization in the areas of Curriculum and Social-Emotional Development and Mental Health.

Participation verification: Attendees will be given a participation certificate after the event. They must attend the entire day to receive a certificate.

Appreciation: Participants who attend the in-person event on Friday, April 5 will hear inspiring messages, receive an event swag bag, be entered to win surprise giveaways, and have the space to celebrate through music, dancing, and food. After the event, educators will rejoin the classroom refreshed and rejuvenated.
